


INTERACTIVE MAP

The trail's most accessed webpage is a customizable interactive map introduced in October 2018.

Key layers include trails, trailheads, route alerts, alternate routes, and campgrounds.

Monthly views have grown 340% since 2019.

COMMERCIAL TOURS

Unknown how many people cycle or hike the trail end-to-end each year.

End-to-end tours offered by commercial operators are growing rapidly.

The average cost of a 2023 tour is \$2,583.


